THIS CONFERENCE is designed to bring together 600+ women who work in every craft in the building and construction trades. Our conference goals are to see more women enter the trades and to offer tradeswomen (both new and experienced) opportunities for networking, skill building, leadership development and organizing.

THE EVENT'S NAME comes from its roots; for nine years, this was the Women Building California conference, sponsored by the State Building and Construction Trades Council of California. The event went national in 2011, when the National Building and Construction Trades Department (BCTD) joined as a co-sponsor. This is now the 13th California conference and 4th national conference for women in the trades, and is the largest conference of its type in the world.

OUR THEME FOR 2014 is "Staying In and Staying Strong." We want to honor our

long-time tradeswomen, and offer them the leadership skills and support they need to navigate a long career in construction.

MORE THAN 30 WORKSHOPS and PLENARY SESSIONS are facilitated by tradeswomen, union leaders, apprenticeship coordinators, contractors, and politicians each year. Workshop tracks include: Preapprentices; Staying in & staying strong; Promoting leadership; Policy and politics; Career ladders, and Nourishing extras.

OPENING THIS YEAR'S CONFERENCE

on the evening of April 25 will be a "Meet and Greet" event for tradeswomen who serve as leaders and mentors to the next generation. Closing the conference will be a Policy Forum on April 27, sponsored by the National Task Force on Tradeswomen's Issues.

A SPECIAL PRE-APPRENTICESHIP PRE-CONFERENCE will be held on

April 25 for those who coordinate and staff preparation for apprenticeship programs. Workshops, round-tables and speakers will enable attendees to share experiences and best practices for recruiting and engaging women in your programs and successfully placing them in construction apprenticeships. We encourage preapprenticeship staff to stay for the full conference.

JOINTLY PLANNED by the California Building Trades Council, Tradeswomen Inc., and the BCTD's Committee for Women in the Trades, **Women Building California and the Nation 2014** promises to be more exciting and productive than ever.
